

**CENTRAL CALIFORNIA IRRIGATION DISTRICT  
IMPORTANT UPDATED WATER SUPPLY INFORMATION – September 17, 2014**

The Bureau of Reclamation has confirmed that through the combined operations of CCID, the other Exchange Contractors and Reclamation that our November/December water will be made available.

Therefore for the remaining months of 2014 the following will be in effect:

**September and October**

- 1) Consumers can move unused January through August water into September/October.
- 2) In addition, Tier 1 and Tier 2 water is available according to the following schedule.
- 3) Tier 1 - \$17.00 /acre-foot
- 4) Tier 2 – (CCID Well Water) - \$40.00 /acre-foot

CCID will continue to facilitate allocation exchanges among consumers. (See page 2)

**November and December**

No water can be moved from the earlier months into November, however, the up to 25,000 acre-feet that was just made available in November/December will be made available to consumers on a first come first served basis at a rate of \$17.00/acre-foot.

## ALLOCATION EXCHANGES AMONG CONSUMERS

CCID will continue to facilitate exchanges among consumers of the water they pumped for credit earlier in the year or their Tier 1 water supply. ## DEVELOPED WATER – CLASS II LANDS – IMPORTANT NOTICE

**There will be no water available from the District for Class II lands.** We will, however, transport private well water for those who have access to wells that can be pumped into our canals. The water will be subject to a \$2.00 per acre-foot transportation/administrative charge, and a loss factor related to the field's distance from a well source.
