1. Call to Order – Pledge of Allegiance

2. Review of Agenda

The Board will consider corrections or additions to the agenda of items requiring immediate action that have come to the attention of the District following the posting of the agenda.

3. Approval of Minutes – October 23, 2019

4. Water Report and Informational Items

- a. Four Entities Watermaster's report on reservoir storage and water supply outlook
- b. CCID water operations
- c. Report on individual water use by CCID consumers
- d. Update of various studies and water supply issues

5. Public Participation

At this time, members of the public may address the Board on matters that are not on the agenda, which affect the operations of the District and are within the jurisdiction of the Board. The President may limit the time allowed for comment. (Members of the public may also address the Board on any matter on the agenda, when that item is brought up.)

6. On-Farm Water Conservation Program

One or more conservation projects that have previously received preliminary approval from the Water Conservation Policy Committee will be described and the Board will be asked to approve incentive grants and/or loans for the projects, and to authorize the execution of the loan documents.

7. **Request by David Santos Farms**

At the October 23, 2019 Board meeting, Ross Filippini asked the Board to consider allowing David Santos Farms to use their Tier 1 Class II water to offset their in-District Tier 3 water. Board action is expected.
8. **Approval of October 2019 Warrants**
9. **Monthly Financial Report**

The Secretary will present figures through October 31 for water sales, revenues and expenses in comparison to the 2019 budget, receivables, investments, and reserve funds for water conservation loans and projects. No Board action is expected.
10. **Schedule of Upcoming Board Meeting**

Due to a conflict with the Water Users Conference held by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation during the fourth week of January, the Board will be asked to approve changing the January 2020 Board meeting to the fifth Wednesday, January 29, 2020. Board action will be requested.
11. **Proposed 2020 CCID Water Rates and Budget**

Staff will present the first draft of the proposed 2020 Water Rates and Budget, based on a Non-Critical Year water supply in 2020, and will go over highlights of the proposals. The Board may either approve the water rates and budget proposal as presented, or may take the proposals under advisement for consideration at the next Board meeting. Specifically, the presentation will include these items:

 - a. Proposed 2020 water rates and tier quantities based on a full water supply
 - b. Proposed 2020 General District budget
 - c. Anticipated revenues and expenditures for the CCID Water Conservation Projects Fund in 2020, with a ten-year cash flow projection for the Fund, from 2020 through 2029
12. **Legal and Four-Entities Matters**

General Counsel and the Executive Director will discuss with the Board current issues affecting the Exchange Contractors and CCID. Board action may be requested on any of these matters.
13. **Miscellaneous Business**

At this time, Board members and staff may discuss matters that are not on the agenda which may affect operations of the District. No Board action is expected to be taken.
