**2. Review of Agenda**

The Board will consider corrections or additions to the agenda of items requiring immediate action that have come to the attention of the District following the posting of the agenda.

5. **Public Participation**

At this time, members of the public may address the Board on matters that are not on the agenda, which affect the operations of the District and are within the jurisdiction of the Board. The President may limit the time allowed for comment. (Members of the public may also address the Board on any matter on the agenda, when that item is brought up.)
6. **On-Farm Water Conservation Program**

One or more conservation projects that have previously received preliminary approval from the Water Conservation Policy Committee will be described and the Board will be asked to approve incentive grants and/or loans for the projects, and to authorize the execution of the loan documents.
7. **Approval of May 2020 Warrants**
8. **Monthly Financial Report**

The Secretary will present figures through May 31 for water sales, revenues and expenses in comparison to the 2020 budget, receivables, investments, and reserve funds for water conservation loans and projects. No Board action is expected.
9. **2020 Elections for Directors**

Fresno County has requested a Resolution from the District for Division No. 5 to be consolidated with the Presidential General Election to be held on November 3, 2020. The Board will be asked to adopt Resolution No. 20-12 and authorize the Secretary to complete any paperwork that is needed by the County.
10. **California Farm Water Coalition – Cultivate California**

Pursuant to a request made at the May 27, 2020 meeting of the Board of Directors, the Board will discuss whether or not to contribute \$50,000.00 to the Cultivate California Program. Board action may be requested.
11. **CCID/Redfern Ranches Scholarship for Ag Leadership**

The Board will receive the report and recommendation from the Scholarship Committee, and will be asked to name the winner of the CCID/Redfern Ranches Scholarship for Ag Leadership. Board action will be requested.
12. **Request for Board Assistance with Environmental Review – J. Wilmar Jensen**

As discussed at the last Board meeting, the Board has been asked to help facilitate the environmental coverage needed for a proposed PG&E extension. As there is a direct benefit to Director Jensen, he will not participate in the discussion or voting of this Board item. Board action may be requested.

13. **Proposed License Agreement – Valley Health Team**

In March 2016, the Board granted a License Agreement to Valley Health Team to place a parking lot on District facilities in Firebaugh. Valley Health Team has asked to add another ten feet to the existing agreement at the same site and utilize forty-five feet total of District right-of-way. Board action will be requested.

14. **Legal and Four-Entities Matters**

General Counsel, the Executive Director and the Manager will discuss with the Board current issues affecting the Exchange Contractors and CCID. Board action may be requested on any of these matters.

15. **Miscellaneous Business**

At this time, Board members and staff may discuss matters that are not on the agenda which may affect operations of the District. No Board action is expected to be taken.
